Coalition for Healthy School Food

As well, we are in touch with Debbie Fields who has worked tirelessly with the Coalition for Healthy School Food to get School Food on the Federal Government's platform and to have them take action to ensure our school age children receive an equitable and nutritious food program in this nation's schools. They have achieved their goal of getting it into the Federal Liberal's spring budget. The next step is to have all 5 federal political parties also make a nation-wide nutritious school food program part of their policy platform. The goal is to also raise this national program as an election issue in this fall's federal election.

From the AFM Chair

AFM had an interesting year in 2018!

I attended the regional roundtable discussions on local food production in the province on a very frigid day in February. There was a wide array of producers and foodies in the room and we had a productive day giving our feed-back to the government of Alberta. The government has since struck a Local Food Council to continue to see about how to make Alberta producers as effective and successful within a provincial framework (and under regulations) as possible.

We managed to pull together the visit to Ermineskin Junior/Senior High in May. Many dietitians and some educators came together in Maskwacis to find out first hand how educator Scott Hall had created such an amazing school food program for very low cost per student. Scott makes a point of sourcing a lot of his menu items locally, and involving the students in the food preparation, so that they would become familiar with making nutritious

and delicious meals as a career or for themselves. It was video taped by CBC and was shared widely among the AFM contacts.
